Planning for High School & Middle School Classrooms

Things to Consider

- How do you envision your NAAE National #TeachAg Celebration?
- Does the event require a budget?
- If you are planning on serving food at the event, remember to check for food allergies.
- Select a suitable date and time that works best for you and your program. National #TeachAg Day can be celebrated ANY time and ANY day of the week. Shift the timeline below to meet your needs.
- Is there an organization in your community that would like to assist you in hosting the event (i.e. Alumni, Farm Bureau, Livestock Club, etc.).
- Order additional decorations or search social media for leftover décor that can match your theme.

August

- Select a location/venue for your celebration.
- Submit facilities requests if needed to appropriate group (i.e. SBDM, PTA, Administration, Community Organizations, etc.).
- Create a guest list for the celebration. Think about who you would like to invite from the community, from your schools, or neighboring schools.
- Send invitations to school staff, stakeholders, and community members who would be interested in celebrating alongside you.
- Test any “Do It Yourself” decoration you would like for the event.
- Send a letter home to parents/guardians to inform them of the celebration. Invite them to participate or volunteer to assist with the celebration.

September

- Print out #TeachAg Interactive Notebook.
- Finalize #TeachAg Day lesson plans.
- Decorate your room with #TeachAg materials.
- Identify students in your classroom who you would like to tag to #TeachAg.
- Plan all your materials for your #TeachAg Lesson.
- Allow students to take part in planning the celebration. Do you allow your students to make dishes and bring them in? Do you want to make a dish as a classroom?
- A popcorn toppings bar can be a fun and engaging way to encourage creativity and delicious fun.
- Send an email to staff in your building about the celebration, encourage them to join in on the hype.
- Make a list of food items if you plan on offering refreshments. Remember to complete the appropriate paperwork to complete the purchase from your school.
- Two weeks prior to the event, count the number of attendees who will be present for your celebration via the RSVP’s from the invitations you sent out.
- Identify students who should be Tagged to #TeachAg. Plan how you will tag them during the celebration.

NAAE National #TeachAg Day Celebration Week Checklist

for High School & Middle School Classrooms

Monday

- Plan your #TeachAg Day outfit for Thursday.
- Share with students your path to #TeachAg.
- Purchase all items for Thursday's celebration if you are offering refreshments.
- Use the Path to #TeachAg poster for your state as a guide for students to discuss how they can become an agriculture teacher in their state.

Tuesday

- Remind students about Thursday's celebration.
- Send a reminder text, letter, or digital announcement to parents/guardians.
- Post on social media to generate excitement for the celebration on Thursday.
- Print popcorn boxes that will be used in the celebration on Thursday.
- Write a welcome for Thursday's celebration.
- Share with students why being an agriculture teacher is the Best. Career. Ever.

Wednesday

- Provide students time to decorate and make their popcorn boxes. Remember to have them write their names on them and leave them in your classroom for the next day's festivities.
- Remind students about the celebration.
- Encourage students to bring in popcorn toppings if they wish. Remember to be mindful of food allergies and sensitivities.
- Double check that you have all materials printed and prepared for the #TeachAg lesson the following day.
- Discuss the different colleges/universities that students can attend to major in agricultural education.

Thursday - National #TeachAg Day!

- Wear your #TeachAg Day Celebration Outfit.
- Ensure your internet is working to watch the premiere of the documentary.
- Pop popcorn before the event. Place the popcorn in bowls in the area where attendees have access. Include a popcorn scoop and hand sanitizer!
- If you are offering a popcorn bar, set out the popcorn toppings. Ensure that all toppings have a spoon or scoop. Host a most creative popcorn contest!
- Provide students with a copy of #TeachAg Interactive Notebook.
- Offer your welcome to begin the event.
- Designate a student to take photos or take photos as you progress through the celebration.
- Tag the students you identified to #TeachAg during the celebration.

After the celebration

- Post photos of the event on social media. Tag appropriate businesses or community groups that assisted you during the event.
- Send out thank you notes to those who helped make your event possible.
- Start getting excited for 2025 #TeachAg Day!

Planning for Collegiate Programs & State Associations

Things to Consider

- Does the event require a budget?
- If you are planning on serving food at the event, remember to check for food allergies.
- Select a suitable date and time that works best for you and your program. National #TeachAg Day can be celebrated ANY time and ANY day of the week. Shift the timeline below to meet your needs.
- Is there an organization in your community that would like to assist you in hosting the event (i.e. Alumni, Farm Bureau, Livestock Club, etc.)?
- Order additional decorations.
- Search social media for décor to match your theme.
- Do you want any other events to accompany the celebration? Host a restaurant night or “Give Day” to raise funds for state association scholarships or University club.
- Are there any games, activities, lesson plans, or celebratory events you would like to incorporate into your celebration?
- Create a celebration team who will assist you in planning the event.

August

- Select a location for your celebration. What venue would serve your celebration best?
- Submit facilities requests if needed to appropriate group.
- Create a guest list for the celebration.
- Send invitations to administrators or stakeholders who would be interested in celebrating alongside you.
- Test any “Do It Yourself” decoration you would like for the event.
- Meet and discuss any possible ideas for the celebration with the celebration team. Delegate tasks to the appropriate parties.

September

- Create flyers for your event and hang them in high traffic locations.
- Meet with your celebration team to plan the final details of the celebration.
- Make a list of all items to be purchased for the celebration.
- Consider inviting a panel of current teachers to your celebration to share their testimonies on why others should join the profession.
- Email invitation reminders for the event.
- Encourage teachers and/or university faculty to join in on the fun and dress for the occasion.
- Two weeks prior to the event count RSVP's to assist in preparing for the celebration.

NAAE National #TeachAg Day Celebration Week Checklist

for Collegiate Programs and State Associations

Monday

- Plan your #TeachAg Day outfit for Thursday.
- Highlight agriculture teachers in your state and their path to #TeachAg. Share your own journey.
- Purchase all items for Thursday's celebration.

Tuesday

- Send final reminder about Thursday's celebration.
- Print popcorn boxes.
- Write a welcome for the celebration.
- Encourage students to plan their outfit for the celebration.
- Make a social media post to encourage others to attend the event.
- Invite students to share what they are most looking forward to within the profession of teaching agriculture.

Wednesday

- Post a social media reminder about the celebration. Tag those you know will be celebrating alongside you.
- Encourage attendees to bring in popcorn toppings if they wish.
- If the space you will be celebrating is available, begin set up.
- Have pre-service teachers share unique lesson ideas on posters around the room. These posters can align to the different courses offered within a school based agricultural education program. If you are hosting a state-wide celebration, have student groups complete the activity on Thursday.

Thursday

- Wear your #TeachAg Day Celebration Outfit.
- Ensure your internet is working to watch the premiere of the documentary.
- Pop popcorn before the event. Place the popcorn in bowls and in the area where attendees have access. Include a popcorn scoop and hand sanitizer!
- Provide materials to decorate the popcorn boxes. Get as creative as you like (googly eyes, pom poms, markers, glitter, etc.)
- If you are offering a popcorn bar, set out the popcorn toppings. Ensure that all toppings have a spoon or scoop. Host a most creative popcorn contest!
- As the program begins, share a welcome and recognize those in attendance who are supporting your event.
- Designate a student to take photos during the event or take photos as the event progresses.

After the celebration

- Post photos of the event on social media, tag groups and individuals who made the celebration possible.
- Send out thank you notes to those who helped make your event possible.
- Start to get excited for 2025 #TeachAg Day!

Venue Ideas

- The Local Drive In.
- Set up a projector and have your own outdoor movie night.
- Rent a local theatre.
- Host the premiere in a community center or regional arts gallery.

Event Collaborators

- Partner with the local movie theatre to host your event.
- Ask for donations for food items from local restaurants or partner with your alumni for a potluck.
- Work with the elementary school or middle school to showcase the documentary to students. Have your agricultural education students develop lessons for students for after the premiere.
- Host a red-carpet event, ask local program supporters to attend the premiere in their best red-carpet outfit!
- Glam bots have been a huge part of premieres across the country. Rent a photobooth or Glam Bot for your event. Does your school have a media department? This would be a great way to collaborate

Movie Premiere Theme Party

- Red Carpet – Dress in your red-carpet best!
- Hollywood favorites – Students dress like their favorite characters.
- College gameday – Encourage students to dress in the college of their choice, especially those that offer agricultural education.
- Anything but a popcorn box – Although students can make their own popcorn box, anything but a popcorn box may encourage the same creativity used to create those awesome lesson plans!
- Glow party – Students can wear their favorite neon colors, wear glow sticks, and watch the premiere. Their future is bright as an agricultural educator.
- Dress like your agriculture teacher – Encourage students to dress like an agriculture teacher for the party!
