WHAT IS THE NATIONAL TEACH AG AMBASSADOR PROGRAM?

The National Teach Ag Ambassador program is for individuals who are passionate about agricultural education and want to share their story. Teach Ag Ambassadors use their enthusiasm to encourage others to consider a career in teaching agriculture.

WHAT DOES A TEACH AG AMBASSADOR DO?

Teach Ag Ambassadors communicate with a variety of audiences to recruit future agriculture teachers and spread the Teach Ag message. Ambassadors are required to attend the National FFA Convention in Indianapolis, Indiana and participate in virtual seminars. Teach Ag Ambassadors receive customized training and lessons to use at local, university, and state levels.



WHO IS RESPONSIBLE FOR THE TEACH AG AMBASSADOR PROGRAM?

The Teach Ag Ambassador program is a component of the National Teach Ag Campaign. The National Teach Ag Campaign is an initiative of the National Council for Agricultural Education, led by the National Association of Agricultural Educators as a special project of the National FFA Foundation, funded by the CHS Foundation, DuPont Pioneer, Growth Energy, and BASF.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

- Currently enrolled in a post-secondary institution
- Agricultural education-teacher certification track majors
- NAAE student member for the 2018-2019 year (\$10/year)
- Must be of sophomore status (or higher) as of June 1, 2018

APPLICATION PROCESS

Application materials will be available on the Teach Ag website in early January. The deadline to apply is April 13th. Finalists will be asked to participate in a phone interview. Selected individuals will be notified in May. All materials must be submitted electronically, according to the application instructions.
