FUTURE AGRISCIENCE TEACHERS SELECTED TO ATTEND PROFESSIONAL DEVELOPMENT SYMPOSIUM

Lexington, KY – The National Teach Ag Campaign has selected 20 agricultural education majors from across the country to attend the Future Agriscience Teacher (FAST) symposium as a part of the National Association of Agricultural Educators' (NAAE) annual convention in December. This group of future agriscience educators will spend five days receiving professional development that will help them in their future careers as classroom agriculture teachers. The symposium will include training in cultural competency, inquiry-based classroom instruction, classroom management techniques, and the development of engaging agricultural curriculum to promote and enhance the science in agriculture. The FAST participants will also be able to attend regional, committee and organizational business meetings, as well as professional development workshops with current agriculture teachers. The NAAE convention will be December 5-9 at the Gaylord Opryland Resort in Nashville, Tenn.

“Networking, along with professional development are essential parts of becoming successful agriculture teachers,” said Ellen Thompson, National Teach Ag Campaign Project Director. “Providing our future agriscience teachers with the opportunity to actively engage with each other and current agriculture teachers at the national level is one of the best ways to develop 21st century agriculture teachers. The FAST symposium at NAAE convention is a great way to accomplish this and ensure we are filling the national demand for agriculture teachers.”
