### NATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF AGRICULTURAL EDUCATORS HONORS RACHEL SAUVOLA AS NATIONAL TEACH AG CHAMPION

LEXINGTON, KY – The National Teach Ag Campaign annually selects individuals and organizations who diligently serve the agricultural education profession as National Teach Ag Champions. The campaign, an initiative of the National Association of Agricultural Educators (NAAE), honors those who have gone above and beyond to recruit and retain high-quality and diverse agriculture teachers, while fostering positive classroom environments which encourage students from all backgrounds to become involved in agriculture.

This year, the National Teach Ag Campaign has selected three agricultural educators as National Teach Ag Champions because of their mentorship of current and future agriculture teachers, their willingness to step up and lead whenever needed, and their support of the Teach Ag message. This year, Ms. Rachel Sauvola, was named one of the three 2020 National Teach Ag Champions.

Sauvola is an agriculture teacher at New Richmond High School, in New Richmond, Wisconsin. Through the agriculture program, she has developed the Students Opportunities with Agricultural Resources (SOAR) educational center. This is where she manages the school farm which produces goods for school lunch. Beyond the classroom setting, she also serves as a NAAE Mentor Facilitator, where her role is to help current and future agriculture teachers develop inquiry-based instruction modules for their students. She is also a National Agriscience Teacher Ambassador and facilitates numerous workshops across the country, engaging other professionals in agricultural education in inquiry-based instructional practices and providing her knowledge and experience to budding agriculture teachers. In addition to these roles, Sauvola is dedicated to mentoring agriculture teachers through the NAAE XLR8 program. For her role beyond the classroom as a mentor for current and future agriculture teachers, the National Association of Agricultural Educators and National Teach Ag Campaign are thrilled to recognize Sauvola as a 2020 National Teach Ag Champion.

The National Teach Ag Campaign honored Sauvola and the other champions as part of the National Teach Ag Day celebration on Thursday, September 17, 2020 from the National Association of Agricultural Educators' (NAAE) office, in Lexington, Kentucky.

It provides its more than 8,000 members with professional networking and development opportunities, professional liability coverage, and extensive awards and recognition programs.
